*Everything that we do in life – every battle that we fight and every mountain that we climb, no matter how many times that we may fall – may be for no other purpose than to prepare us for that moment when we are called upon to make a difference in this world.*

"After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem <sup>2</sup> and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." <sup>9b</sup> they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. <sup>10</sup> When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. <sup>11</sup> On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. " **(Matthew 2:1-11)**

The Wise Men came "from the east" and followed a star so that they could worship the newborn King. Realize that they weren't blessed with the full light of scripture that is available to us today. They didn't fully understand that this baby ultimately would be our Savior. Nevertheless, they put their faith into action and made the long journey to present gifts to Christ.

This can serve as an example to us as we go through our daily lives. We have the benefit of knowing the rest of the story. We know that this child was God in the flesh. We know that He lived a sinless life and gave Himself up as a perfect sacrifice to atone for our sins. We know that He conquered death so that we may have eternal life. Overjoyed to bring our gifts to the same Jesus that the Maji travelled so far to see that first Christmas?

We should rejoice that we are baptized children of God and fellow believers in Christ. How blessed we are!

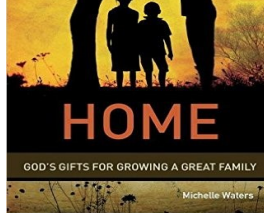
