#### Wild Game Dinner: From field to table

A big bowl of rich, spicy, axis deer chili. Seasoned, smoky, venison sausage sizzling on the bar-b-q. Succulent breasts of dove swimming with dumplings in a thick sauce. These hearty wild game dishes delight the palette and are just some of the delicious fare that will be featured at St. John's annual Wild Game Dinner benefiting charity April 29, 2017. Since the event's inception in 2001, St. John has raised more than \$359,712.00 that has been given to local organizations as well as those around the world.

Game meat makes for great eating whether it's fowl, venison, ground game, or the feral hog, a domesticated pig gone wild. Harvesting wild game makes a lot of sense because it helps to manage bird and deer populations and in the case of the feral hog, mitigate the damage caused by these destructive animals.

Wild game has great health benefits compared to ranch-raised meat. Wild game animals eat a natural diet and are very active contributing to a lower fat content. Additionally, they have a lower content of pro-inflammatory omega-6 fatty acids and a higher content of anti-inflammatory omega-3 fatty acids. Furthermore, the meat is a good source of protein and minerals such as iron and zinc.

In the Hill Country there are three types of wild game harvested by hunters that nicely go from field to table, making delectable dishes. The white-tailed deer is the most common animal harvested and is strictly regulated by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPW).

Brought to Texas from India in the 1930's, the Axis deer is another popular wild game deer. These animals are abundant in the Hill Country, and because they are an exotic species, are not regulated by TPW.

A third animal avidly sought by Texas hunters is the feral hog, an animal not much different than commercially raised domestic hogs. An estimated 1.5 million feral hogs roam uncontrolled in Texas, causing millions of dollars in damage to property and crops. The State considers these animals a nuisance and hunting them is not regulated by TPW.

White-tailed deer, axis deer, and feral hogs are harvested with a firearm or bow and arrow. Feral hogs can also be trapped. Once an animal is harvested, it is field dressed, which involves removing all internal organs and allowing the carcass to cool in order to prevent the meat from spoiling. The next step is the butchering and processing the meat. All hunters have their preferences, so the meat can be processed in many different ways. Some of the common uses for wild game meat are roasts, steaks, jerky, grind for sausage, and grind for hamburger. The wild game meat then can be prepared and served in the same manner as any meat from the butcher.

God has blessed us in the Texas Hill Country with an abundance of wild game. Let us partake of and enjoy this delicious, low-fat, free-range meat that is as good as or better than meat purchased at the market. Hope to see everyone at the Wild Game Dinner next April!

#### Greetings to you, brothers and sisters, in peace and joy...

What a blessed and huge summer just flew by! Now I find myself already knee deep in classwork for my

SENIOR YEAR in the Master's of Divinity program here at Trinity School for Ministry, in Ambridge, Pa! I truly cannot wrap my mind around all that has occurred over the last few months, but I thank you for your prayers and support and want to share with you as much as I can about all that has happened

since I returned to PA in June to begin my CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education) program. I was blessed to experience SO much growth this summer, within myself and in relationship to this vocational call to ministry in the Church. Again, thank you, thank you for your prayers and support! St. John is such a Godsend in this discernment process for me!

Summer Recap and Looking Ahead...

This summer I was one of six students accepted to the Clinical Pastoral Education program at UPMC Shadyside Hospital here in Pittsburgh, PA. The program is 400 hours of educational and clinical hours in the hospital serving as a chaplain. I was given three units within the hospital to oversee, which added up to about 200 patients in my care at all times. There was an oncology unit, a cardiology/surgical unit, and an ICU unit that I was given to care for as a chaplain. For the summer I served these units as a chaplain and walked alongside any patients who came onto my floors who was open to having me with them. We also rotated on-call shifts, so weekly I was assigned overnight duties, but thankfully only had to go in once for an emergency (even if that one time was on my very first night on-call in our first week of the program! haha). On top of seeing patients we had to present case studies every week to our supervisor and CPE group.

We also had reading and other written assignments to complete each week, outside of keeping up with our patient and staff visitations. Had you asked me in the middle of the summer how things were going my voice might have gotten really high and pitchy as I tried to convince myself I would survive, but looking back I have nothing but gratefulness and joy toward that entire experience. It was an honor to learn from these patients and my peers, to be let into the innermost lives of those who were brought onto my floors; to build bonds and friendships with beloved patients in just a matter of hours or days; to be at the deathbeds of those whom I had grown to love, and who had considered me their friend. I will never fully be able to put to words what an honor it was to work alongside these patients this summer. I learned so much and I carry with me the wisdom many of them chose to share before they passed away.

Now I find myself back in the call as a full time student here at the North American Lutheran Seminary at Trinity School for Ministry. I cannot believe I am already a SENIOR!! Wow! Where did the time go?! As I look ahead I am keeping myself open to whatever the Lord may have in store for the coming season. This fall I am taking four classes, serving as a Sacristy Team Leader, serving as the Compline service manager, helping in our school's kitchen, playing for the school flag football team, and serving on the prayer team for campus Eucharist services every Wednesday. It is already a busy semester and I feel like we just started, but fall break is only two weeks away! Time really is flying and part of me is really ready for it to slow down (especially with the early signs of oncoming winter already upon us! Haha). However, in all things I give thanks to our Savior for His provision and grace. Without Him I know that none of this would be possible, and everyday that I get to wake up and pursue those things He has for me to learn in this life is truly a miraculous gift of grace.


