The Widow's Offering

<sup>41</sup> Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. <sup>42</sup> But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents.

<sup>43</sup> Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. <sup>44</sup> They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to

live on." (Mark 12:41-44)

It is so easy today to get wrapped up in the rat race of life and forget what is truly important. We are constantly bombarded with ads and commercials trying to get you to spend money on the latest gadget, newest car, or best electronics. Even if you are responsible with your finances, budgets are set up to cover the bills, save for college, and plan for retirement. When it comes around to giving to the church, it is tempting to give what might be left over. If we REALLY stretch, maybe we can give 10% - as long as everything else is taken care of.

The widow in the scripture above gives us an impressive example to follow. In those days, there was no Social Security or safety net for the poor. As a widow, she was left to fend for herself. Instead of keeping what little she had to live off of, she gave it all to God. This showed incredible faith that He would provide for her needs even when she had no idea how. We can learn from this by giving control to God and placing our trust in Him.

In the next few months, the Stewardship Committee will be presenting information about alternate forms of giving (other than cash and checks) including:

- Automatic withdrawal from checking accounts
- Credit/Debit Card payments
- Gifts of stocks, bonds, mutual funds, etc.

These options are intended to accommodate different preferences within our congregation. Please note that giving traditional offerings will always be an option.

Remember, God isn't interested in the *amount* you give. He wants you to give joyfully and unselfishly from your heart and trust that He will provide. After all, everything we have comes from Him.
