I'll be in Nashville next week for North American Lutheran Church's annual Convocation. Our denomination gathers once a year to hear from Bishop John Bradosky, worship together, study the Bible together, and conduct the business of the church. The NALC is only seven years old, but already we've grown to 141,000 members meeting in 400 churches across the US and Canada. It's inspiring to be

NALC which connects congregations with mission partners locally, nationally, and abroad. God sends us out into the world that more people might come to know Him. It's a joy to be a part of a church – as a congregation and denomination – which takes that calling seriously.

God also calls us to make disciples of those who come to Him, and I'm very pleased to announce that our Council unanimously voted to join the NALC's Life-to-Life Discipleship Initiative. The goal of the Initiative is to create a culture of discipleship in our denomination by building a pathway for discipleship in individual congregations. It's a three year commitment. It will take time and hard work, but it will all be worth it once we've got a means to help people grow in the Christian faith and walk more closely with Jesus. I'm very eager to be leading this Initiative here at St. John and have made it my primary goal for the next few years. You'll be hearing much more in the months to come, and seeing the fruit in a few years, but I wanted to share my excitement with you today.


