From the Pastor's Pen

For years now, it's been my discipline to get up early in the morning, make myself a cup of coffee, and start the day by reading and reflecting on God's Word.

God spoke to me as I journaled on this verse. I wanted to share those insights with you.

God fed His people as they walked through the Wilderness, giving them manna, the bread from heaven. God feeds us as we walk through life, giving us His Word.

God faithfully fed His people every day of their forty years in the Wilderness. God faithfully "gives us each day our daily bread."

The Hebrews had to go out and gather the manna every morning. God gave it to them by grace, but they had to work to go and get it. God "gives us each day our daily bread," but we have to make the effort to go and gather it in.

If the Hebrews didn't gather the manna in the morning, it melted and they went hungry that day. If we don't read God's Word first thing in the morning, chances are we won't read God's Word at all. It's all too easy to let

the busyness of the day take over, so that our time is taken up doing this, that, or the other. It's all too easy to let the idleness of our flesh take over, so that we

spend hours online, in the newspaper, on the phone, or on the couch. It's all too easy to let other things crowd out the space and take up the time for God's Word. It's all too common that our daily bread grows cold and stale on the plate while we, like Martha, bustle about in the kitchen, "occupied with many things."

God "gives you each day your daily bread." What's keeping you from it? Do you have a plan for reading the Bible every day – a time to read it, a place to read it, a passage of Scripture to read? Take your Bible off the shelf now and put it by your favorite chair. Put a bookmark in the Psalms and read one a day, or in the Gospel of Mark and read a chapter each morning. In the time it took you to read this article, you could have read that Psalm or a passage from God's Word. God "gives you each day your daily bread." Why go hungry? Go and get it!
