From the Pastor's Pen

The first week of June brings the last week of school and the start of summer. It's a season of rest for our kids and recreation for our families. It's got me thinking about the Sabbath.

The Sabbath is a day set aside for the Lord and holy to Him. God commanded His people to keep the day holy by keeping themselves from work. "Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work" (Ex 20:9-10). God gave His people two

reasons why.

First, because the Sabbath was a day of rest. "For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth...and rested on the seventh day" (Ex 20:11). God rested from His labors, and wanted His people to rest from their labors, too. On the seventh day, God stood back to enjoy what He had made. On the Sabbath day, God's people stepped back to enjoy what they had done and what He had given them. The Sabbath was a time for rest, for family, for worship; a time to enjoy life.

Second, the Sabbath was a day of redemption. "You shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the Lord your God brought you out from there" (Dt 5:15). God's people were slaves defined entirely by what they did, how useful they were, and how much they could accomplish. But God freed them from Pharaoh, made them His "Chosen People," and commanded them to identify themselves not by their work, but by their rest. The Sabbath was "a sign forever between Me and the people

of Israel" that they were His (Ex 31:17).

We are Christians, not
Israelites. The sign that we
are God's people is baptism
(Mt 28:19), not the Sabbath.
Our rest is in Jesus ("Come
to me, and I will give you rest"
Mt 11:28), not on a day of the

week. We remember our redemption by the Sacrament (Lk 22:19), not by the Sabbath.

But the Sabbath is still important for us. It reminds us that we are not defined by what we do, how hard we work, or how much we accomplish, but as people redeemed by God. It reminds us that we are not made to spend our days in endless labor; God wants us to rest and enjoy life. Set aside time to rest and relax this summer. It's what God wants you to do.

Today, consumerism grips our society. For proof, just look at the number of commercials and ads that you are subject to on any given day. We seem to be in a constant competition to wear the nicest clothes, drive the newest cars, live in the biggest houses, and own the best cell phones.

This, however, is not a new phenomenon. The author of Ecclesiastes writes about similar issues in ancient society. His experience is that this is all meaningless.

"10Whoever loves money never has enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with their income. This too is meaningless.

11 As goods increase, so do those who consume them. And what benefit are they to the owners except to feast their eyes on them?"

- Ecclesiastes 5:10-11

Spending energy and effort to constantly increase our wealth and possessions will leave us still longing for more. Ultimately, we run the danger of allowing this pursuit of stuff to interfere in our relationship with God.

While there is nothing inherently wrong with wealth, there is an issue with anything that crowds God out of your

life. He has promised to provide for our needs. Anything above that is extra and should be viewed as a blessing. Having this perspective frees us up to give more generously of the abundant blessings that God has first given to us.

Latest update on **Dadi Ishimwe**:

Spiritual Growth: All the children have what is called their Ikinyarwanda name. It is not a family name. It is a name the family chooses for the child upon their birth. "A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold" (Prov. 22:1). Ishimwe means praise Him. When Dadi was asked how his Ikinyarwanda name inspires him, he responded that he wants to live the meaning of his name and praise God all the time.
