From the Pastor's Pen

This month brings two changes to our church. First, we welcome back a familiar face. At my personal request, and with unanimous Council approval, Pastor Henry Schulte has agreed to accept the title of Pastor Emeritus. "Emeritus" is an honorary title which recognizes the love and respect a congregation has for it's retired pastor. We'll give Pastor Schulte that

recognition at our worship services on July 15th and celebrate with a catered meal in the Family Life Center after church!

The second change is a start of a movement toward a new Sunday morning schedule. Beginning August 19th, all three of our worship services will be held in the Sanctuary - 8:00 Traditional, 9:30 Praise, and 10:45 Traditional. Our food and fellowship will move from the Gathering Place into the Family Life Center, with a continental-type breakfast replacing our current offering of cookies and coffee. The Children's Sunday School will move into the Family Life Center. The Youth Sunday School will move into the Education Wing, Children & Youth will no longer need to leave Main Building and go across the street into Luther Hall, or the Shepherd House, or Faith Hall. All of our Sunday morning education will be in the same building at the same time.

With the Praise Service in the Sanctuary, the Family Life Center will be available to the congregation throughout the week for fellowship, meals, children and youth activities, and intergenerational gatherings. It can even be available to the community for programs, gatherings, and events. Our Education Wing and Family Life Center will be put to use as originally intended, and we will have taken a major step toward our Vision of a united

church which "meets in the same building on the same block, following a plan to optimize and improve our facilities."

Lastly, and a benefit that's near and dear to my heart – Pastor Bergquist and I can be present in each worship service

from beginning to end. We won't have to leave the Traditional Service to preach at the Praise Service. We'll be able to participate in all our worship services and give each the leadership it deserves.

The Strategic Planning Team, Worship Committee, Family Ministry Committee, Council, Staff, and I have put hours into this plan over the last four months. We're all solidly behind it, but I'm sure you have questions. Council President Scott Kramer and I will host a town hall meeting on July 8th at 9:15 am in the Sanctuary. Please come, ask your questions, and learn more.

Speaking of leadership, we have formed a Nominations Committee to identify next year's Council members and officers. They are tasked with matching skills of individual members to the needs of church governing bodies and leadership positions. If you receive a call from a member of this committee, please give it your careful and prayerful consideration. St John depends on its members replying "Here I am, Lord. Send me." Members have been doing just that annually for nearly 90 years, thanks be to God.



It's time for the annual school supply drive benefiting Sam's Kids!





July Disaster Relief Trip Marks 1 Year of Monthly Trips by Volunteers from St. John

The July Disaster Relief Trip is scheduled for July 13-22, 2018. This 10 day trip will be the 14th trip in 12 consecutive months of relief efforts.

Hurricane Harvey made landfall in August of 2017 and devastated millions of people on the Gulf Coast of Texas. Since then, volunteers from St. John have embarked on monthly trips to the coastal towns of Rockport, Aransas Pass, Ingleside and Portland. Led by Lance Folkerts, these teams help to clean-up, rebuild, and provide comfort and hope to those affected.

In the past 12 months, volunteers have cleaned up debris, trees, yard waste and trash from more than 35 homesites. They have demolished 20+ homes, garages and outbuildings that were damaged or destroyed. After the clean-up, the rebuilding began. Volunteers have shingled roofs, fixed electrical, framed out structures, replaced drywall, repaired fencing, provided appliances, and committed to a complete rebuild project. But, perhaps the most important service that these loving volunteers have provided is the comfort, hope, laughter, and joy that they happily give to those affected by

HURRICANE RELIEF

Volunteers will be insulating, framing, shingling, drywalling, siding, painting, and working on electrical.
