From the Pastor's Pen

Jesus said to His Apostles, "If you abide in my Word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:31-32). Jesus promised that if we abide in His Word if we live in the Bible, make it our home, spend time with it day and night - then two things will happen. First, we will know the truth about the God who created the world and finally stepped in to save it. Second, the truth will set us free. God will work through His Word to change our hearts and transform our lives.

We're going to take God up on His promise this year. Starting September 9th, our whole church family will go through the whole Bible together the whole year. We're using a version of the Bible called The Story, an abridgment of the Bible in the easy-to-read NIV translation, arranged chronologically so that it reads like a novel. We'll be preaching The Story from the pulpit, studying The Story in all of your youth and many of our adult classes, and reading The Story at home. As we abide in the Word together, God will work in our lives and in our church.

We'll also have the chance to study the faith together on Wednesday evenings. Beginning **September 12th**, I'll be teaching what Luther's *Small Catechism* says about the Apostles' Creed, the foundational statement of who God is and what He has done for us. It's all part of our new **Cross Generational**

Family Ministry, when we gather as a church family to share

a meal, study the faith, learn from each other in guided conversation, and worship God. I've always loved teaching and look forward to this new way of teaching the faith together, across generations, as a church family.

The month ends with our annual Congregational Meeting on September 30th. Come hear what God has done in our church this past year, and where we believe God is leading us to go next year. St. John Lutheran is your church. Come get involved, cast your vote, and have a say in what we do.
