A NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP

Do More with God

After a long day, the disciples realized that there was no way on earth that they could find enough food to feed everyone in the crowd. To go buy food would take far more than they had. What were they to do? Andrew spoke up that the only thing they had was a few loaves of bread and 2 fish, but knew that was nowhere near enough to feed everyone.

Jesus took control. After thanking God for what they had, he distributed the food. Miraculously, in the end the disciples gathered 12 baskets full of leftovers

Note that faced with a problem, the disciples (Jesus' inner circle) didn't think to pray or turn to him for help. It is interesting, though that the boy willingly gave all that he had to help out. Jesus

⁵ When Jesus looked up and saw a great crowd coming toward him, he said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" ⁶ He asked this only to test him, for he already had in mind what he was going to do. ⁷ Philip answered him, "It would take more than half a year's wages to buy enough bread for each one to have a bite!" ⁸ Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, ⁹ "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?" ¹⁰ Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." There was plenty of grass in that place, and they sat down (about five thousand men were there). ¹¹ Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish. ¹² When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." ¹³ So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten.

- John 6:5-13

used this act of faith to perform a miracle. It appears that he was trying to teach his disciples a lesson by having them gather the 12 baskets full at the end.

He is also teaching us a lesson. God can do far more with what we give than we can on our own. We should prayerfully give thanks for what we have and be willing to use it to serve God's purpose.






