A NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP

Giving From the Heart

41 Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. 42 But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents. 43 Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. 44 They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everythingall she had to live on." -Mark 12:41-44

Mark's gospel reinforces here that Jesus is interested in our heart, not strict legalism. That is why the large amounts of money given by the rich did not impress him as much as the few cents from the poor widow. The rich gave part of what they

had - maybe even a tithe. Likely to look good in front of others and follow the letter of the law.

The poor widow gave all she had to the Lord. Not just what she should give, but more....all she had to live on. That is showing complete trust in God to provide. Although the amount was small, the sacrifice out of her love for God was huge.

As we approach the close of 2018 and the beginning of 2019, we should consider what we are willing to give for Christ. Are we willing to keep the commitment that we pledged in our Plans for Giving? Are we willing to give more?
