From the Pastor's Pen

I went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land last month with 40 people from St. John and other churches. One of the most powerful experiences was visiting the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. This one, massive church is built on the site where Jesus was crucified, died, and

was buried. As you come in the front doors, on the right is a chapel leading up to Golgotha. You can wait in line to kneel down and touch the place where the Cross stood. As you exit the chapel, there by the front

doors is the stone on which Jesus' body was anointed for burial and wrapped in a linen shroud. You can kneel down and touch the stone, fragrant from centuries of pilgrims' anointing. Going farther, all the way to the left of the Church, is a chapel built over the Tomb where they laid His body. You can wait in line to kneel down and touch the marble stone that for the past 18 centuries has covered the shelf where Jesus' body was laid—the very place where Jesus rose from the dead.

I waited in line and knelt down at each one. It was a powerful experience that brought a catch to my throat and tears to my eyes. I felt the presence of God in that place. I felt the Spirit touch my heart. The pilgrimage to the Holy Land was the trip of a lifetime. We flew halfway around the world to visit the places where Jesus was, to relive the familiar story of His death

and resurrection, and feel the touch of His presence once again. We weren't the only ones. People from every tribe, tongue, and language stood in line with us and experienced the same things beside us. People from all around the world were coming to Jerusalem to

meet Jesus.

People from all around Boerne will be coming to our church to meet Jesus this Easter. You don't have to go halfway around the world to find Him. Jesus finds you where He

promises to be: "where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am in the midst of them" in the Word and in the Sacrament. We expect hundreds of people to come to our church on Easter Sunday. The parking lot will be full, the lines will be long, and someone may be sitting in your spot. Welcome them to God's house. Pray that God will touch them here. Ask God to open their ears to hear His Word, and open their hearts to believe in His Son.

Two thousand years ago, in that place I just visited, Jesus died for us and rose from the dead. Jesus is alive now and drawing people to Himself. We get to be a part of it. Pray for the people God will bring to our church.

It's Not Always Easy

Matthew 26:39, 42

Even though he was concerned about the difficulties that he was about to encounter, he was committed to carrying out what he had been called to do.

Each of us has a purpose to fulfill. We are given certain talents, capabilities, and resources for a reason. We are put in the right place at the right time to carry out



Confirmation Banquet with a High School Student and Mentor Reunion


