From the Pastor's Pen

Christmas always comes December 25, but Easter falls on a different date each year. This year it's quite late. **Easter** commemorates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, who was put to death during the Passover in Jerusalem. We want to commemorate the day and the season that Jesus rose from the dead, but the Jewish calendar is a lunar calendar

and works differently than ours. Passover always falls on the first full Moon after the Spring equinox. So Easter always falls the first Sunday after that. This year, Easter falls on April 21. That's still some time away, but Lent is right around the corner.

Lent is the season of preparation for Easter. As Jesus spent 40 days in the Wilderness preparing for His ministry, so we spend the 40 days of Lent preparing for His Resurrection. But that's 40 days not including Sundays, which, as the Lord's Day, is always a celebration of the Resurrection.

Lent begins this year on March 6, **Ash Wednesday**, with services at 10:00 am in the Chapel and 6:30 pm in the Sanctuary.

On Ash Wednesday, we prepare ourselves for the celebration of Christ's Resurrection from the dead by reminding ourselves that we all must die: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." We prepare ourselves to receive the forgiveness Christ won for us by

reminding ourselves that we are sinners He had to die for. Ash Wednesday is a somber service, and Lent is a sober season.

Lent is a season of prayer and fasting. I plan to fast from food one day each week. **What will you fast from?** It could be something you like or enjoy, which you give up as a reminder

that you love Jesus even more—

something like chocolate, or coffee, or wine. It could be something that gets in the way and takes up your time, which you give up to spend more time with Jesus—something like TV, or Facebook, or screens.

What will that something be for you? Spend some time now praying about what you'll fast from this Lent.

Then join us on **Wednesdays** this Lent, beginning March 13, as we gather for soup and bread at 6:00 pm, and for prayer and worship at 6:30 pm. We'll sing the Holden Evening Prayer again, but this year we'll also hear testimonies from St. John people about what the Lord has done in their lives. You won't want to miss these real-life stories of faith.

Our mission is to "Know Jesus and make Jesus known." I pray you'll come to know Him better this Lent.

is Come". Lutheran Hour Ministries
provided the float, in a 69-year tradition
carried on by the Lutheran Laymen's
League of Southern California.

The float featured a huge page of sheet music, large musical instruments and

bells, a choir, and a manger scene.
Volunteers from all over America
descend on Pasadena to decorate the
float with roses; they are called Petal
Pushers

And yes, it was the only Christian unit among 91 in last year's parade. Kudos to those faithful Lutherans who are carrying on this awesome tradition. Let's watch for the Lutheran 70th annual float next January 1st. Know Jesus, Make Jesus Known.

Give Up and Give

Lent is upon us. We are reminded during this season that God gave his only son to die for us-you and me - to wipe away our sin so that we can be reconciled to Him. This year, we should also consider what we can give to God during Lent. Whatever it is, we should want to give joyfully to God in response to His love and sacrifice for us.




Happy Hearts • March 11, 6pm


