A NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP

A New Perspective

Soon after Jesus' death and resurrection, Christianity was spreading rapidly - contrary to the intentions of the Jewish authorities. Believers had changed their perspective from our physical life on earth to an "eternal" focus of everlasting life. These new Christians gave everything they had not because they had to, but because they no longer found value in accumulating wealth on earth. Instead, they saw real value pursuing a relationship with Christ and spreading the Good News with the help of the Holy Spirit. They were completely devoted to their faith and to each other.

Today we are still called to give to the church. Tithing (10% of our income) is what the Bible tells us contribute with the intention of tying our heart to the church's mission of spreading the gospel. If we do not have an eternal

perspective, 10% seems like a lot to give up. But if we understand our life on earth is just a fraction of the time we will ultimately spend in the presence of God's glory, giving 10% back to the church may only be the starting point.

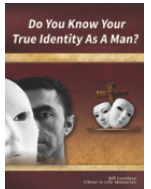

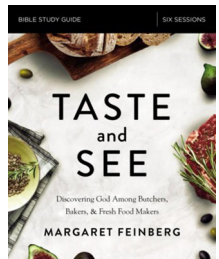

Dads: Learn some great information and tips for strengthening the bond with your daughter

With the Father-Daughter Dance quickly approaching, we found some great info about the Influence that Dads have on their daughters from a Christian group, Focus on the Family. Here is an excerpt from their online post:

Dr. David Popenoe, Professor of Sociology at Rutgers University and Co-Director of the National Marriage Project, says that fathers provide a positive male role model. This is perhaps the most crucial gift he can give his little girl. He doesn't do this by focusing his attention upon her. Instead, it happens as he devotes himself to her mother. All of this prepares her to have healthier relationships with boys in adolescence and with men in adulthood.

There are a number of things you can do to help amplify the message in a more intentional and direct way. You can, for example, take time to date your daughter on a regular basis. You can get together over coffee or spend an hour talking over a nice meal. You can make a point of attending father-daughter dances and banquets.

Remember that your daughter needs nurturing and protection. She needs verbal reassurance and appropriate physical touch. She needs to know in her heart that her dad is a man of integrity who keeps his word and follows through on his promises. Meet these needs, and you will do more than prepare her

to meet the challenges of life in this world. You will teach her what it means to trust her heavenly Father. You will show her how to present herself to Christ, the heavenly groom, as a pure and spotless bride.

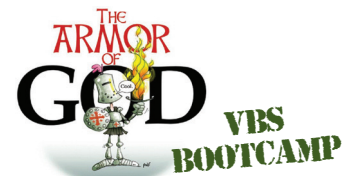
