From the Pastor's Pen

We took the Reveal Survey a few months ago. Now that the results are back and the report is in, I wanted to share with what the survey said. We've got **four strengths to build on.**

First, St. John is a fundamentally sound congregation. Over all, our spiritual beliefs and practices, how we put faith into action, and the church's role in it all, is right where

Second, when compared to other Lutheran churches, St. John is at the top 15-20% that have ever taken the survey.

we're supposed to be.

Third, we have an above-average rate of reading and reflecting on Scripture. That's a great sign for the future, since reading and reflecting on Scripture is the most powerful driver of spiritual growth. And **fourth**, this congregation does a good job of making people feel like they belong. Overall we're in good shape, with four solid strengths to build on.

But the survey also revealed **four things to work on**. The first is our demographics. We're an older congregation, 30% more so than the national average. Four out of five people are over the age of 50. That's not a bad thing, especially since empty nesters and retirees are one of two groups moving into Boerne. But young families with children is the other, and we have far less of them than we should—about half the national average. That's the **first** thing we need to work on. The **second**.

oddly enough, is the Bible. Though we scored above average on "reading and reflecting on Scripture," we scored below average when it comes to "teaching sound doctrine rooted in biblical accuracy." Only half our people said the Bible has authority over their

daily lives. Only two-thirds believe they're saved by grace and not by anything they do. We need to work on that. A **third** is that we're only average when it comes to teaching people the spiritual disciplines of daily Bible reading and prayer. The two

most important priorities that all the people who have ever taken the Reveal Survey list for their churches are "Help me understand the Bible in depth" and "Help me grow in my personal relationship with the Lord." Our church is only doing an okay job; we need to do better. And **fourth**, we need to do a better job helping you reach out. People grow in their faith when their church provides opportunities to put their faith into practice. We're below average, and need to provide more and better opportunities to serve.

Thank you for taking the time to take the Reveal Survey. It's shown us four things to build on and four things to work on. It's given us a picture of who we are, where we are, and how we can grow from here.




