From the Pastor's Pen

Jesus gave us a **Great Commission**: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them... and teaching them to obey all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20). Jesus gave us a **Great Commandment**: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. Love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 10:30-31). We've been doing all those things for years here at St. John Lutheran Church, but these last two years a small group of us has been thinking about how we can do them better. We've come up with a plan that we call the **Discipleship Pathway**.

The Discipleship Pathway answers the questions "How can we help people grow in their faith?" "What does a disciple do?"

The first two steps on the pathway help us "love the Lord your God." A disciple loves

the Lord by Worshipping Weekly. Through worship, we show our love for God, giving Him our worship and praise. Through worship, God shows His love for us, speaking to us through His Word and giving His Son in the Sacraments. But we should love the Lord our God every day, not just on Sundays, and so a disciple loves the Lord by Walking Daily, too. A disciple devotes time every day to Jesus, listening to hear God speak through the Bible and responding to God in prayer. This daily quiet time is a key exercise that grows our faith as we follow the Lord, day by day.

The next two steps on the pathway help us "love your neighbor as yourself." In order

to love your neighbor, you have to know your neighbor, so a disciple **Connects Consistently** with the church. We want St. John to be a church where no one feels isolated or alone, but everyone has some place "where everybody knows your name." Regular and consistent connection with the church—whether through Sunday School, Bible study, Friends in Faith, or some other way—makes a disciple feel loved and gives the opportunity to show love for others. Finally, a disciple loves others by **Serving Monthly**. Serving others, whether at church

or in the community, puts our faith into action. Serving others helps our faith come alive. "Even the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve" (Matthew

20:28). We become more like Jesus as we serve others, like He did.

None of these should be new concepts. All of this we've been doing for years. But the Discipleship Pathway brings clarity to **what** we do and **how** we do it. Jesus gave us a Great Commission to make disciples. Jesus gave us a Great Commandment to love God and neighbor. The Discipleship Pathway helps us do what Jesus has called us to do. You'll be hearing a lot more about it throughout this coming year, beginning with our kick-off sermon series in the Fall.


