From the Pastor's Pen

We remain focused on Discipleship this month and next. On Sunday mornings we'll continue to preach about **Worshipping Weekly** and **Walking Daily**, key ways to obey the Great Commandment to "Love the Lord your God." On Wednesday nights we'll study the Ten Commandments. Our **Cross-generational** ministry starts up again on September 4th. Each Wednesday begins with a meal, then moves to teaching about one of the Ten Commandments—sometimes in a large group, other times in small groups, always as a community of faith. We follow it up with an opportunity to put faith into action as we serve. Cross-gen is a great way to get involved with the church, step out in service, and learn how to live your faith.

Another great way is through our **New Members** classes. A disciple is someone who **Connects**

Consistently with the church. If you've been attending awhile, and looking for the opportunity to get more involved, now's your chance. Classes are offered on Thursday evenings 7:00-8:00 pm. Find out more information and sign up online.

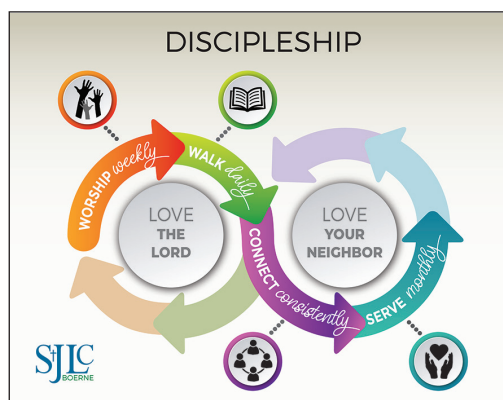
A disciple **Serves Monthly**, and we'll spend most of this month and next preaching about serving. The staff has been working hard over the Summer to build a way to more easily connect people with service opportunities at church. The Fall always brings plenty of opportunities—at the church picnic,

Operation Christmas Child, Trashcan Turkeys, and many others. This Fall a hardworking, dedicated team from our church will launch an ongoing ministry to serve in the community. It's a partnership with Hill Country Daily Bread called "**Growing Hope.**" I'm really excited about this ministry and the impact it can have on our church and our community. You'll be hearing more about it soon.

Finally, the end of the month brings our annual **Congregational Meeting**. We have two big structural decisions before us. The first is about our physical structures. What should we do with our buildings? How should we build for the future? Council has been hard at work on these questions for almost a year. We're ready to bring forward a

Facilities Master Plan for the congregation's approval at the meeting. The second decision is about our governing structure. Council recommends consolidating three committees into one so that we can be better stewards of the church's mission and outreach funds, making each mission dollar go farther and all the mission dollars work together. These are big decisions; these are your decisions as church members. Come and let your voice be heard.

MESSAGE from the CONGREGATION PRESIDENT

In early August, the annual convocation of the North American Lutheran Church (NALC) met in Indianapolis. It includes a mission festival, worship, and conduct of the business affairs of the church. There are 433 congregations in the NALC, and 142,000 members. Those Lutherans were represented by about 800 delegates and guests.

We rejoiced over the many blessings our Lord has provided. We shared the joy among the delegates, and among those following online, as the meetings were

streamed worldwide. Questions arrived via text message, from across the continent, and were answered in our meeting.

We also faced our responsibility to confront the challenges in God's church. One is the future supply of pastors. The vast majority of current pastors are nearing retirement age, and the seminary enrollments are not projected to fill the gap. So, NALC churches are taking action to grow the seminary, to provide internships for pastoral candidates, and to encourage young people with a heart for ministry.

We were uplifted by the progress of the Lutheran church in Ethiopia, a mission partner of the NALC. It is the largest group of Lutherans in the world! Yes, there are 8 million Lutherans in Ethiopia, an increase of 1 million in the past 2 years. When they have church gatherings, they don't just fill buildings, they fill stadiums! We give thanks and praise for the Holy Spirit's work through us, each doing our own part, knowing Jesus and making Jesus known.

Raising Kids in a Social Media Generation A Class for Parents and Grandparents Sundays, 9:35am and 10:45am, Beginning September 8th

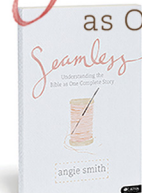

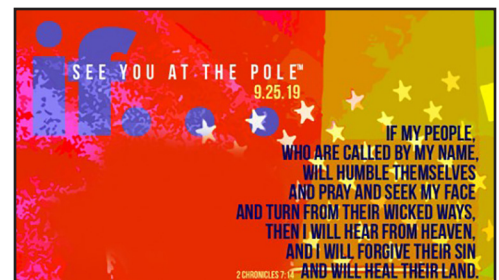
