From the Pastor's Pen

We wrapped up the Fall sermon series on discipleship last month. This month I need your help creating a new series for next year. The new year will be 2020, and I'm working on a series called "20/20 Focus on Faith." I want to write a series responding to the questions you have about our Christian faith. What troubles you about our religion? What don't you understand? What beliefs don't make sense to you? What have you always wanted to ask? Let me know, and come January we'll begin a series of thoughtful answers looking at those real questions.

Our sermon series for this month focuses on stewardship. We begin on November 10th with a guest preacher. The Rev. Dr. Jerry Kieschnick, retired President of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, will preach on "Final Fruits

Giving." We've recently started the **St. John Legacy Endowment Fund**. Pastor

Kieschnick will preach about leaving a legacy gift to continue the work of the Lord long after we're gone, and there will be the opportunity to learn more about our Legacy Endowment Fund at a Sunday School class that day. I follow it up the next week with "First Fruits Giving," a sermon about the spiritual discipline of giving and the various ways and opportunities to give at our church. We end it with a sermon called

"Thanks Giving" on November 24th. That will be **Consecration Sunday**, when we invite you to bring your 2020 Pledge for Giving card to church and lay it down before the Lord.

And of course, the days after Thanksgiving are **Dickens on Main**. Thousands of people will flood downtown Boerne on those two nights to shop, celebrate, and enjoy the "snow." Hundreds of them will park at our church. We'll be ready once again this year with our Nativity Scene all set

up, our church restroom opens to the public, luminaries lighting the sidewalks, and Christmas
Eve promotional cards under every windshield.

November is going to be a good month at St. John
Lutheran, and it all begins this weekend with **All Saints' Sunday**. This Sunday we remember our loved ones who have departed this life and now rest in the Lord. Next month we'll remember the birth of the One who died and rose for them—and us—to give us all peace. In all the hustle and bustle of this Holiday Season, be thankful and keep a 20/20 focus on Him.

MESSAGE from the CONGREGATION PRESIDENT

It was a beautiful autumn day on the family farm, in a busy harvest season. I was a young boy, but old enough to drive farm equipment on public roads. The corn harvest was in full swing; in those days, the full ears were pulled from dry stalks by a corn picker. Ear corn dropped into a wagon, which hauled the load to storage for future shelling. There were tractors, wagons, trucks, and a corn picker in coordinated movements around the farm.

My grandfather pulled me aside and said, "These next two loads go to the

harvest festival. Take them to town." I knew exactly what he meant. So I hitched up two full wagons behind a Farmall H tractor, and began the 30 minute trip to town.

In town was our family church, Hope Lutheran, which held an annual harvest festival. Membership was predominantly farmers, and part of the annual tradition was the corn pile. In a grass lot adjacent to the church building, there was a large auger and a pile of ear corn.

I pulled up to the auger and added 300 bushels to the pile, from Kramer Farms.

A few months later, a work crew assembled and shelled the corn, a church member providing the equipment. The grain was sold to a local elevator, and proceeds deposited into the church account

I will always remember that experience, giving first fruits to the church, and the abundance of God's blessings at harvest time. Then and now, praise God from whom all blessings flow.

A NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP

Give Your Best

"3In the course of time Cain brought some of the fruits of the soil as an offering to the LORD. 4And Abel also brought an offering—fat portions from some of the firstborn of his flock. The LORD looked with favor on Abel and his offering, 5but on Cain and his offering he did not look with favor. So Cain was very angry, and his face was downcast."

- Genesis 4:3-5

At first glance, this passage can be confusing. Why did God favor one offering over the other? Shouldn't he be pleased that they were both giving some of what

they had as an offering? But upon closer look, you can see while Cain gave some of his crops,

Abel gave the fat (best) portions of the firstborn. You get the impression that Cain grudgingly gave out of obligation, while Abel joyfully gave out of his love for God.

This teaches us that God

is asking us for our best. He doesn't want us to just be going through the motions and giving what we have left over - if we have something left over. No, our Father wants us to give off the top, before anything else. Why? To tie our heart to His church, so that it is the priority in our life. An offering that is joyfully given out of love is pleasing to the Lord.

Consecration Sunday is coming up on November 24. This is the time that each of us can make a pledge of our planned giving for 2020. Please prayerfully consider giving your best to our Lord.


