We've started the season of Lent, the season of preparation for the joy of Easter. Lent is the time of year when many of us recommit to a spiritual discipline. Pick up a bookmark with a daily Bible reading plan to help you spend the First 15 minutes of every day with the Lord. Redouble your commitment to Worship Weekly, too, and join us for our midweek Lenten services. Every Wednesday evening, 6:30pm-7:00pm in the Historic Chapel, we'll gather to sing the Holden Evening Prayer and hear a member of the congregation share about his or her walk with Jesus. It's a chance to learn the real stories of how the Lord is moving in the lives of the people around you. Come early and share a meal with your church family, too. ### Our special offering for Lent this year will be directed to the work of the main Lutheran Seminary in Ethiopia.

The Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus (EECMY) is



the largest body of Lutheran-Christians is the world. They have about 9 million in membership, over 50% larger than a decade ago. Missionaries are being sent out with thousands turning to Jesus Christ. They're now making plans for when they number 30 million.

Right now, there is only one seminary trained pastor for every 3,000 members. Without sufficiently educated leaders, the future of the EECMY is at risk. Leadership needs to be well trained and grounded in God's Word.

The Mekane Yesus Seminary in Addis Ababa is the largest residential seminary of the EECMY. They still do not even have reliable broadband internet, absolutely critical for education in today's world. Their satellite site in Bishoftu does not even have adequate running water. The raising up of church musicians is hindered by inadequate equipment.

It is hoped that funds raised by this Lenten appeal will support their work in these much needed areas. Please pray for the EECMY, the Mekane Yesus Seminary and their future. Pray for all those who are touched by its work.
