From the Pastor's Pen

"Do not be afraid!" (Matthew 28:5).

Those were the first words from God that first Easter Sunday. The women had come to the Tomb heartbroken, convinced that Jesus was dead and all was lost. They arrived at the Tomb and their blood ran cold, so terrified were they by the appearance of the angel. But angels are God's messengers, and God sent this angel with Good News "Do not be afraid!" Why? "For I know that you seek Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here. He is risen!" (Matthew 28:5-6).

Christ is risen from the dead, and that changes life for you and me forever. The unexpected may happen—has happened to all of us over these past few weeks. Tragedies may happen—will happen to all of us at some point in our lives. Our hearts may be broken, our blood may run cold, but all is not lost—because we seek Jesus, and He is risen! Christ's victory over death and over sin is a victory over fear, too. We cannot change what happens around us anymore than the women could change what happened around them that first Holy Week. But no matter what happens, we do not need to live in fear. Christ is risen! Jesus lives! Turn to Him, trust in Him, and "do not be afraid."



That was the message God first gave to the world on that first Easter Sunday morning. That's the message God still gives to us today. **Who in your life needs to hear that message?** Bring that person to God in prayer. Ask God to move in that person's life. Ask God to send a message to that person, whether through a song on the radio, or an article online, or a preacher proclaiming the Gospel, or someone God sends into their life—and that "someone" might just be you. You might be the "someone" that someone else is praying for to speak truth and hope in that person's life. So pray for that person every day between now and Easter. Invite that person to come with you to church.

And **pray for me**. None of us knows what will happen this Easter, what life will be like that second week of April, or whether we'll even be allowed to gather. But I guarantee you this: I'm going to preach God's Word, the Gospel, the Good News "Do not be afraid, for Christ is risen!" Pray for me, that God will give me a powerful message. Pray for me, that God will give the opportunity for that message to be heard. Now more than ever, people need to hear it. That's what the church is here for. Pray that God will work through us.

The Truth Project • April 19

A 2017 survey indicated that only 10% of Americans operate with a Biblical World View. That number decreases the younger the person is. This means only one in 10 of our population looks at life through the lens of Biblical understandings.

Starting Sunday, April 19th we will begin a 20-week in-depth look at key Biblical World View issues using the study series, The Truth Project from Focus on the Family Ministries.

Note: If on April 19th we are still unable to meet in person, we will be sending out video links and discussion questions via email and encouraging one another with this material.

The following are the first few lesson topics:

Lesson 1 - Veritology: What is Truth? The Truth Project begins by defining truth as "that which corresponds to reality." This absolute and eternal truth, at the heart of Jesus' mission on earth, continues to be the focal point of the Cosmic Battle in our own time.

Lesson 2 - Philosophy and Ethics: Says Who? Truth is not simply an academic concept. Our understanding of right and wrong is directly dependent on our worldview: is the universe God's creation or a closed cosmic cube?

Lesson 3 - Anthropology: Who is Man? The Bible tells us that man was created in God's image but fell from innocence through sin. Modern psychology, on the other hand, asserts that man is inherently good and behaves badly only under the influence of social or institutional pressure. This lesson explores the implications of both views.

Lesson 4 - Theology: Who is God? Eternal life, according to Jesus, is knowing God in an intimate, personal, and relational way. Such knowledge, which is possible only because of divine revelation, transforms us from the inside out as we begin to see ourselves in the light of His majesty and holiness.

This class will be held at **9:30am and 10:45am** and is for **Adults and Juniors and Seniors in High School**. Meet in **Room #117**, bring your Bible and a notebook as we, by His Spirit, seek to grow in wisdom and Biblical maturity.
