# From the Pastor's Pen

This month marks the start of our new Sunday morning worship times. Beginning August 2nd, the Late Service will move 15 minutes from 10:45am to 11:00am. The Early and Praise Services will remain unchanged, so that our new worship times will be 8:00am, 9:30am, and 11:00am. That means our Livestream will start at 11:00am, too.

That extra fifteen minutes will give us much-needed time to make the transition between the Praise and the Late Services. Those of you who worship in either of those services have no doubt seen how tight that transition can be. It's not uncommon for

early arrivers to the Late Service to come walking into the Sanctuary while the Praise Service is still going on. It's not unusual for the Praise Service to run a few minutes late and cause a back-up in the Lobby. The transition between the two services has always been tight, especially on Sundays with special rites like Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, or New Members, or when the Choir sings. It's even tighter now in this coronavirus season which requires extra time for pew cleaning and Communion preparation. This is the right time to make a change to our Sunday morning worship schedule that will make our Sunday mornings flow more smoothly. I'd like to get that new schedule in place before the school and church years start up once again.

Speaking of which, you may be wondering, "What other changes are coming down the pike?" I only wish I knew! As I write this in early July, one week after the Governor's mask mandate, I remain optimistic that schools will open up as scheduled and life will start to get back to normal. But if there's one thing we've learned in this coronavirus season,

it's how much things can change from one week to the next. I was hoping to have our Sunday Breakfasts back at this point, but that wasn't in the cards. I'm planning to start our church year activities—Sunday School, Bible studies, Wednesday

evenings, and the like—with the start of the school year. We'll see if that's possible come late August and early September. Time will tell what our church life will look like this Fall.

We do know that the coronavirus has given us an unexpected opportunity to reach people in Boerne and beyond. Sunday after Sunday, more people join us online than in our church. The livestream has become our "fourth service," and we should start treating it like one, moving more of our educational, discipleship, and worship resources online. This is the cutting edge of ministry coming out of the Covid Crisis. I'm eager to see where it
