### From the Pastor's Pen

That's a lot of waiting. Five times in two verses, the psalmist uses that one word "wait." Some people might call that repetitive, but I think it's powerful. As

we read through the psalm, the psalmist forces us to do what he finds himself forced to do—wait.

We find ourselves forced to wait a lot these days. The watchmen may wait for the morning, but he's only got hours to wait. We've been waiting for two and a half months now, and still no sight of dawn. How much longer till we can go out in public again like we used to?

How much longer till we can gather in church again like we want to? How much longer till we can do the things we used to do without fearing we'll get sick? No one knows, no one can say... and so we wait.

That can get tedious and discouraging unless we do what the psalmist tells us to do: *"I wait for the Lord, and in his word I hope."* Who would have thought the Bible would have a psalm for a season like this? And yet it does an entire psalm about waiting, and waiting, and waiting some more. God's Word is our hope. God's Word gives us hope.

"I wait for the Lord, my soul waits for the Lord, and in his word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen wait for the morning, more than watchmen wait for the morning."

Psalm 130:5-6

Lately I've found myself reading more of God's Word than I'm used to. For the past week now I've spent an extra

15 minutes in the Bible. reading through the Minor Prophets three, four, or even five chapters a day. Amos is hardly what you'd call a hopeful book-it's not for nothing he's known as "the Prophet of Doom"---and yet reading his Book has given me hope. I've felt myself calmed and settled by extra time in God's Word, and caught myself reflecting throughout the day on something I read in the mornina.

"I wait for the Lord, and

*in his word I hope.*" We've all got a lot of waiting to do, and too much waiting can make the heart grow sick. Wait with the Lord. Wait in his Word. If you need a place to start, start with Psalm 120 and read one psalm a day to the end of the Book. Read each psalm slowly, read each psalm more than once. Listen to what God is saying, and you'll hear Him speak.

God's Word is hope, and God's Word brings hope to you. Wait through this season with Him.

#### The blessing of leaving a Godly Legacy

Having spent the last few newsletter articles reviewing use of our time, talents, and treasure, we will turn now to stewardship as it relates to our "final fruits," i.e. leaving a Godly Legacy. The verse from Proverbs 13 reminds us to keep our life goals, vision, and legacy top-of-mind in all our financial decisions, as every financial decision is really a spiritual decision! When we consider our daily "wants" compared to our future "wants," it pretty quickly becomes evident how temporary satisfaction pales in comparison to leaving a legacy of purpose and generational fulfillment. The use of the term "inheritance" in Proverbs 13 is not limited to money. Meanwhile, history shows that ideas, including Darwinism as a social philosophy, have definite consequences – consequences that can turn ugly when God is left out of the picture.

# Boerne Community Coalition HEARTS OF LOVE FOOD BAGS

LOVE Boerne Kids, a program of the Boerne Community Coalition (BCC), assembles Hearts of Love Food Bags to be delivered to children participating in the Summer Lunch Program. To help meet the increased need and reach more children this summer, **the BCC has partnered with St. John Lutheran Church to provide a drive-thru / walk-up service for our Hearts of Love (HOL) Weekly Food Bags.** These bags will contain 7 breakfast items, 7 lunch items, 7 pieces of fresh fruit, and daily snacks (all non-perishable except the fruit) designed to provide food for a child for one week (except dinner), replacing the free meals they receive while in school. We are working with Blessings in a Backpack and the Boerne ISD to ensure the parents/guardians of children who are now receiving BISD Meal Service are aware of the summer distribution at St. John Lutheran Church. We hope to provide up to 300 HOL bags per week for 11 weeks of summer. The cost to provide food for one week to a child facing food insecurity is roughly \$15, or \$165 for the entire summer!

If you are interested in volunteering for the HOL Weekly Food Bags over the summer, please visit our website under 'Events'. High school students can earn service hours, and we have opportunities for student leadership.
