From the Pastor's Pen

As I sit down to write this article, it's been exactly one month since we suspended all in-person activities at the church. By the time you're reading this, it will be more like **six weeks**. That's a long time, and I miss you. You may have seen me online, but I haven't seen you.

I miss you, especially at **Communion**. One of the highlights for me every week is when I get to stand before you, look you in the eyes, and put the Body of Christ into your hands. It's one of the few moments when I as a pastor get to speak directly to you as an individual. I love that point of touch. But now we don't have it anymore.

Several people have asked if we could get it back by sharing a "virtual Communion" online, the pastors consecrating the Sacrament in the Sanctuary while people join in with their own bread and wine at home. That's a question that many Christians have been asking, all Lutheran pastors have been wrestling with, and different Lutheran churches have answered in different ways—so much so that our Bishop stepped in and sent a *Pastoral Letter on Virtual Communion* to each and every pastor in the NALC. Bishop Selbo writes,

For the sake of the unity of the North

American Lutheran Church, I request that we place a moratorium on the virtual sharing of the Lord's Supper until we have allowed ourselves sufficient time to come to a thoughtful and prayerful and collective understanding around such an important and significant issue.

We may not be able to celebrate Communion for a while, but we still are a church of Word and Sacrament. In this season when we have to fast from the Sacrament, how are you feasting on God's Word? Your Daily Walk with the Lord is more important now than ever. You may not be able to receive the Lord Jesus in the bread and wine, but you can still hear His voice in the Word and follow where He leads you day by day. With all the time you now have on your hands, are you spending the First 15 minutes with Him? Read a portion of the Bible every day; reflect on what God is saying to you; respond to Him in prayer and with obedience. We cannot be together, but you are not alone. The Lord is with you: Walk Daily with Him and Worship Weekly with us online.

I know you'll see me. I'm looking forward to the day when I'll see you!

Deuteronomy 6:5-9 says: ⁵ Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. ⁶ These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. ⁷ Impress them on your children.
