We'll be **decorating the church** the first day of the month, Tuesday, December 1, beginning at 9:30 in the morning. It will be a good opportunity for fellowship and service, and a good way to get in the spirit for Christmas. **Come and join us!**

Come and join us at the **Christmas Cantata and Children's Program**, too. This year we're combining the two events into one and offering it twice on the same Sunday, December 13, at the 9:30am and Ilam services (the 8am service will be as usual). Our Director of Music Ministry, TJ Bazzoon, and our Praise Band Leader, Gareth Goode, are working together to provide us with great music. The physical, emotional, and spiritual effects following the loss of a loved one can be devasting. The good news, is that grieving folks who find a support group often discover that the process from mourning to joy is possible.

GriefShare is a 15-week program where participants will find support and practical advice from professionals via a video component that addresses many feelings associated with death.

Each of the 15 sessions stands alone, and it is not necessary to begin with the very first one. A participant can start at any point during the cycle.
