# From the Pastor's Pen

Happy New Year! And may this new year coming be better than the one that was. If 2020 taught us anything, it's that so much is outside of our control and beyond our influence. But there are some things we can control and influence. The most important is our time. The Lord has given

each and every one of us the same 24 hours in a day. It's up to us how we use them. I know many of us are busy, with demands on our time from dawn to dusk. But you can always find 15 minutes to spend with the Lord. That's what I'm asking you to do this year.

Make it your New Year's resolution to **spend 15 minutes in a Daily Walk** with the Lord. It's the single best thing you could do for your faith. Remember the Reveal Survey we took two years ago? We were one of over 2,000 congregations that participated. The Survey found that, across the country and different denominations, daily reading and reflecting on Scripture have the most powerful impact on spiritual growth by far—far more than any other single practice. So if you want to grow in faith this year, spend time with the Lord every day.

Let me show you how. I'm teaching a **4-week class** on Wednesday nights called "First 15: How to Walk Daily with the Lord." It's a very practical class that



will walk you through the nuts and bolts of a personal devotional time and equip you to spend daily time with the Lord. I won't just teach you these things: I'll be doing them with you, walking alongside you as you learn to Walk Daily with the Lord.

I want to see our church grow in health and

numbers. Growth begins with you, as a member of the church body, spending time with the Lord. If you're not already doing that, make it your resolution to start this year. If you need help, let me show you how.

There's a lot we can't control or influence in our lives, but we can choose how we spend our time. Choose to spend daily time with the Lord this year.

**s3H.e.e.p.**: Some will be continuing on while some will be starting something new:




6th Graders will be finishing their review of the Old Testament and then starting the New Testament!
