From the Pastor's Pen

The whole month of March is given over to the season of Lent. By this point, you've been at it now for a few weeks. Whatever Lenten discipline you've chosen should be well familiar to you by now. Maybe you've adapted to it and made it part of your everyday life, but more likely the initial rush of energy and zeal has given way to the realization that six weeks is a long time. It

is! The six weeks of Lent make for a long season of discipline and self-denial. It's all too easy to start wondering if you'll make it to the end, and second guessing why you did this to yourself in the first place. Don't give up! Like Spring training for a baseball team, God is at work on you this season, getting you into better spiritual shape.

God is creating in you a clean heart. Your response is to be steadfast and patient. Keep at it. Keep doing those exercises. Keep faithful to those disciplines. If there's one thing I've learned through many a Lent, it's that steadfastness is the key to spiritual progress. God is at work on you; don't you give up on Him.

God is at work in our church, too, bringing new members into our church family. I give God thanks that our church has continued to reach out into the community and grow even during this past year. Pr. Bergquist, Vicar Alliyah, and I are meeting with our New Members every Sunday this month. You'll get to meet them yourself on Palm Sunday, March 28, when we officially welcome them into the church.

Palm Sunday begins the most important week of the year: Holy Week, when we

remember and give thanks for the suffering, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Plan to worship with us on Palm Sunday as Jesus rides into Jerusalem, on Maundy Thursday as Jesus celebrates the Last Supper, on Good Friday as Jesus dies on the Cross, and on Easter Sunday as He rises again. The discipline of Lent leads us to

the new life of Easter. Keep steadfast, and finish the journey strong!

Finishing well is the theme of a special event we're hosting called "Leave a Positive Legacy." It's on March 21, 3pm-5pm in the Family Life Center. We'll have a panel of experts to share their wisdom and answer your questions, and a resource to get you started on your planning. Look for more information here in the newsletter. I hope you can join us.

Our Lenten Trials

March is the season of Lent in the church year, a time when many of us are sacrificing something precious to us as we remember Jesus' 40 days of temptation in the desert. Just like Jesus, we could easily end our temptation any time we want. Our cookies, snacks, or other things we sacrificed are usually only a few steps away, but we hold fast to our conviction, enduring through our trial.

It is important to remember why we do this. Our sacrifices are not a requirement for salvation. We have already been saved through the sacrifice of that perfect offering, Jesus. Rather, our abstinence from these small earthly desires serves to remind us that we should be giving everything to God. Paul writes in Galatians: "and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by

Christ lives IN YOU. My challenge to you during this lenten season, is to test yourself with your lenten sacrifices, but use them

Examine yourselves to see whether you are living in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not realize that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless, indeed, you fail to meet the test! I hope you will find out that we have not failed.

SUNDAY MORNINGS IN MARCH

Elementary students are in the final stretch of their designated Bible Study for this year.

Here is a brief update on how God's Word is being shared with them.

K-1st Graders: Jerimiah and the Exile will be the main focus as students realize that disobedience to God leads to bad consequences. But, repentance brings forgiveness and renewed life when turning to Him.

2nd Graders: Through parables about Bridesmaids and Grape Growers, Jesus shows that we need to be diligent and prepared for His coming. Also, at whatever point of the journey we are on, His grace and mercy are beyond belief!

3rd Graders: Studying the Gospels, they will walk with Jesus to Jerusalem and then the cross.


4th Graders: Following Paul and Timothy's missionary adventures, students will realize how the gospel continued to spread both in times of everyday life and times of great danger.

'IN HIS IMAGE'

The theme verse for our s3.H.e.e.p. Ministries is something Jesus said just before telling his disciples that he is the good shepherd. He says, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; but I have come that you may have life and have it to the fullest." (John 10:10) Jesus wants the best for us. But what do we do when the world (the culture) shouts that God's Word is wrong?

The movie, "In His Image," speaks directly to this as churches wrestle with the culture regarding the truth about homosexuality and transgenderism. It is a conflict that will not go away and we need to be equipped to know both sides of the discussion. Our current culture has made it clear on how it stands, but what does the Bible

really say? What does science really say? What do some personal testimonies of homosexual and transgender people really say about their life experience?


Watch for more information, but know we are looking to have photos start at 7am and continue throughout the noon hour. There are no scheduled appointments - pictures will be first come, first served.


