A NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP

True Freedom

Freedom. There is perhaps no word more integral to our identity as Americans than freedom. And yet, if you asked a dozen people what freedom means you would get a dozen different answers. God calls us to a special kind of freedom - a freedom from the world while still caring for the world. This is not a freedom we have earned in ourselves. Christ set us free through his sacrifice on the cross, and we now have the choice to accept and live in that freedom or allow ourselves to once more be yoked to the slavery of the world.

God wants the best for us, but what is best for us is often not what we strive for. We toil and stress over obtaining money or distract ourselves seeking constant enjoyment. These are temporary pleasures with worth that fades over time. Paradoxically, when we give up our time, money, and possessions to God and use them to help our neighbors,

we gain greater freedom. In sacrifice to others, we see the joys God has given us

in our own lives. In returning our money and talents to the Lord, we learn that we should not grasp so tightly to worldly pleasures. Paul says in 1 Corinthians:

"I have the right to do anything," you say—but not everything is beneficial. 'I have the right to do anything'—but not everything is constructive. No one should seek their own good, but the good of others."

Don't be yoked to the slavery of the world, which wears down your spirit and inhibits your growth. Find true freedom in following Christ and in helping your fellow man by giving your time, talent, and treasures to the Lord.



Understand this Christian Journey better with a deeper look at this story of Pilgrim. Determine what part of the journey you are currently facing and find strength to face it.


All our children and youth will be going through the book as well via an animated movie.

July 11 Legality Hill: Struggling under the increasing weight of his burden, Christian sees that this hill is too steep to climb. Legality's voice thunders from the top of the mountain. He refuses to take away Christian's burden until he climbs the mountain. In order to reach the top, he must obey every commandment without missing any. "Don't Move!" "Obey the Rules." "Walk." "Don't Question My Authority." The laws continued to pop up around Christian.

July 18 The Gate: If we feel that we are being led astray, or feel that we are under attack, we must call on Him for help. Here, the King sends help in the form of His Word. All of a sudden the ivy covering the door reveals the words "Knock and the door will be opened," referencing Matthew 7:7. He knocks and is immediately allowed inside by the gatekeeper.

July 25 The House of the Interpreter: How often do we find ourselves in darkness, not knowing which path to take, and we simply do not ask for help? Christian learns four spiritual lessons from the Interpreter that expand upon this truth: God will give us knowledge, understanding, and guidance, but we must learn how to discern what is from Him, and what is not.

The physical, emotional, and spiritual effects following the loss of a loved one can be devastating. The good news, is that grieving folks who find a support group often discover that the process from mourning to joy is possible.

GriefShare is a 14-week program where participants will find support and practical advice. Each of the 14 sessions stands alone, and it is not necessary to begin with the very first one. A participant can start at any point during the cycle.

A new StJLC GriefShare cycle, under the guidance of Pastor Mariola Bergquist, is scheduled to begin in August. Registration at www.griefshare.org is highly recommended but not required.
