From the Pastor's Pen

May is here, the school year is coming to a close, and our church program year with it. What a year it's been! I was just at a pastors conference (online, of course) where one of the speakers put it this way: "This last year was like ten years of change packed into one." A year ago, I was sitting around the kitchen table with my family, folding and preparing the May newsletter for mailing

because the church was still closed. When we reopened a few weeks later, I set a goal that we'd have two-thirds of our people come back to worship inperson by the time the school year was over. I am delighted

to report that we have met that mark. Our in-person attendance has been over 275 for the last three Sundays. It's great to see so many people back in church again. It feels like we've been reborn!

That's what this month is about. May is not only the month we celebrate Mother's Day and the miracle of birth; it's also the month we celebrate **Pentecost** and the birth of the Church. Forty days after He rose from the dead, Jesus ascended back into heaven. Ten days after that, the Father and the Son poured the Holy Spirit out upon the Apostles. Peter, the same man who three times denied even knowing Jesus, now preached a sermon that brought 3,000 people to faith! What happened? What changed? The Spirit happened, and the man was changed! The Holy Sprit anointed Peter, set Peter's soul on fire, and freed Peter's mouth to proclaim the Good News of Jesus, crucified and risen from the dead.

Two thousand years later, we preachers still rely on that same Spirit, too. A few years ago, I put together the **Preacher's**



Prayer Team, a weekly email with specific prayer points for that Sunday's sermon. Almost 200 of you signed up for that Preacher's Prayer Team, but there's room for plenty more. If you'd

like to receive that weekly email and haven't signed up already, please let me know and I'll add you to the list. Pastor Bergquist, Vicar Alliyah, and I count on your prayers every week.

Speaking of **Vicar Alliyah**, she's entering the final weeks of her internship year here at StJLC. She'll start interviewing with churches around the nation. Please, pray for Vicar Alliyah every day in your devotional time, asking that the Holy Spirit will direct and lead her to just the church He has in mind. It's obvious to us all that God has a calling upon her life to serve the Church. Pray that His call to serve a particular congregation will be loud and clear.

Our cheerful service unites us with the community around us and reminds us to let go of our earthly possessions and goals, and to strive for God's goals for us. Our generous gifts will be repaid generously by our Father who loves us and cares for us.

Important Update to St. John's Covid Policy: Effective May 1



St. John's Council met in April and unanimously voted to lift the covid restrictions in the following ways, **effective May 1**:






