From the Pastor's Pen

Jesus commands us to "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). Heaven, John saw, is a place where "people from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages" stand before the throne of God and worship Him day and night (Revelation 7:9). This month, we'll have the opportunity to worship with believers from other nations in our church.

St. John has supported the **Houston** Oromo Evangelical Lutheran Church for years, recently helping to purchase land to build a church of their own. A delegation from the Oromo Church will visit on **August 1** and worship with us at the Late Service. Pastor Kamiso Boru will be bring greetings and update us on his church's ministry. Then the delegation will treat St. John to a home-cooked **Ethiopian meal** in the Family Life Center. If you've never tried Ethiopian food before, here's your chance-it's delicious: savory vegetables, flat breads, and spicy meats, something like Indian food. Come join us!

The following Sunday brings a guest preacher from the **Lutheran Church of South Sudan**. Millions of Sudanese have been displaced by years of civil

war, living now in refugee camps in Kenya and Ethiopia. Trinity Lutheran Seminary and College is planting new congregations in the refugee camps and training pastors to serve them. Pastor Jordan Long, President of the seminary, will share that story when he preaches at our services on **August 8**.

Then on **August 15** we begin a seven-week series on the **Book of Revelation**. The events of the last few years have left me wondering what this world is coming to. Naturally, I turned to the Bible for guidance, and over the last year have made a study of Revelation. I'm eager to share with you the Good News that's found there. Join me in the months of August and September as we preach our way through the Book of Revelation. It's a hard book, but a fascinating one, and one which speaks a Word we need to hear in this season.

On a final note, it's been five years now that I've served as your Senior Pastor.

Michelle and I moved down here in August of 2016. Boerne is a wonderful place to live, St. John is a great church to serve. Thank you for calling us.

A NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP

Christ In Us

There is a simple table prayer our family prays many nights before our meal: "Come Lord Jesus, be our guest, let this food to us be blessed. Amen." We say it so many times that we can forget to think about what we are saying - that we are asking Jesus, our Lord and Saviour, to come and be a guest at our table. We are asking him to be present with us, not just at the meal, but in our hearts and lives. Having Christ live in us is a radical transformation - we are not just following a list of rules of behavior. Instead, we strive to live our lives in accordance to how Jesus would have lived his - with full obedience to the Father and charity to our fellow brothers and sister.

As Paul tells us, it is through faith that we allow Christ to live in us - faith that Jesus exists, that He is present with us, and that He is there to support and guide us. Once we have that faith, and have Christ's power in us. Paul then tells us to use that power with "all the Lord's holy people." Jesus wants us to communion with each other - to be present and active in our communities. Indeed, the ultimate purpose of the power we have been given is to "grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ." When living through faith, with Christ in us, our worldview shifts - no longer should we be focused on our accomplishments or needs, but on serving each other the way Jesus served us.

I encourage you to ask Christ to be your guest, not just at your meals but in all your life, and to allow Him to transform you into a new creation, serving others through donations of your time, talent, and treasures, to bring I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ.

Ephesians 3:16-18 (NIV)


Texas 36th Infantry Division who were surrounded and cut off for days, all of which combined to make them the most decorated unit in the history of the U.S. Army.





for a weekend of learning and fellowship, fun, and worship.


Registration will be available from September 1-27
