### From the Pastor's Pen

I love to sing. The church staff and my family will tell you that I'm singing all the time, often not even aware I'm doing it. We'll be singing all this month at StJLC.

Our sermon series this month is on well-known Christmas carols. Each Sunday in Advent we'll sing a carol about the coming of the Lord, and then hear the pastor preach about it. The two Sundays in Christmas we'll sing and preach about our Savior's birth.

The second Sunday of December is truly a time for singing! On that Sunday, December 12, the 8am service will meet as usual, with a sermon on "Joy to the World." But there'll be no service at 9:30am. The Praise and Late Services will meet together at 11am for our annual Christmas Program. The children will proclaim and act out the Christmas story, the Praise Band and Choir will lead us in song. It promises to be a wonderful worship service—and we'll follow it with a wonderful Christmas Congregational Meal! It's a day you won't want to miss. Come and join us!

Later that week, on December 15, come and join us for the Christmas Churches by Candlelight event. We'll meet here at StJLC, then walk up to St. Helena's Episcopal, and close the night at First United Methodist, enjoying fellowship at each church and singing carols along the way. It's an opportunity to worship with other believers in Boerne. Come and join us!

And, bring your family and friends to our Christmas Eve services. We'll have three services this year, at 4pm, 6pm, and 8pm. The 4pm is an interactive Family Service, tailor-made for the little ones. They'll hear the story of Jesus' birth, sing carols, and put ornaments on the Christmas Tree. It's a hands-on experience held early in the day so your little ones can worship, too. Then at 6pm we'll have our Traditional Christmas Eve service with carols, choir, brass, Communion, and (of course!) "Silent Night" by candlelight. The 6pm service will be livestreamed so family and friends can join us online. The 8pm Traditional Service will follow the same format, but without livestream and with different musicians. No matter which service you choose, we'll worship Jesus and sing His praise. Come join us!

Christmas Eve falls on a Friday this year, which means the day after Christmas is a Sunday. We'll have only one service on that Sunday, December 26, at 11am, so that our volunteers can enjoy time with their families. Come join us the day after Christmas, too—but remember, only at 11am

There's a lot to sing about this time of year, and we'll be singing all month long. Come join us!






### Many thanks to all who participated in the **Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Event!**
