From the Pastor's Pen

The New Year has come, that time of year when many of us make resolutions to live better. If you're anything like me, your New Year's resolution may not even make it to Valentine's Day. It's hard to do better and live better on your own. It's easier when someone else is making the same resolution with you. That's what we're doing this year for you. For this month of January, we'll review our picture of a disciple here at St. John Lutheran Church. We'll challenge you to resolve to take one step in each of the four parts this year.

Disciples Worship Weekly. Worship attendance in America has been on the decline for years, even before the pandemic. Many Christians now might worship only twice, or even once, per month. I challenge you to add one time more. It's a simple step, but one which will fortify your faith and help our church to grow.

Disciples Walk Daily. You've heard me preach that spending the First 15 minutes of the day with the Lord is the single best thing you can do to grow in your faith. This year, I challenge you add one thing to that First 15: give thanks for one thing every day. That simple act of gratitude can expand your soul and change your perspective on life.

Disciples Connect Consistently. For years now, Americans have grown more and more disconnected from each other, a trend that only accelerated during the pandemic. Feelings of melancholy and gloom grow when people feel lonely and isolated. We don't want that for you! We want you to know your brothers and sisters in the Lord, want you to feel like a part of our church family. So I'll challenge you this year to connect with one group at church and learn a handful of names.

Disciples Serve Monthly. Jesus said, "Even the Son of Man came to serve" (Matthew 20:28). The Father wants us to be like the Son, but we can't be like Jesus unless we serve like Jesus did. Serving others is how we put our love for neighbor into action, how we mature in our faith. I challenge you this year to grow in your faith by serving one time each month this year.

New Year's resolutions are great, but they're even better when you're not making them alone. Make discipleship a part of your New Year's resolution this year—and let St. John Lutheran help you.




This important and impactful study has blessed many in our congregation and millions around the world. "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind." – Romans 12:2
