From the Pastor's Pen

Jesus gave the church a mission to "Go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19). We've spent three years building a picture of discipleship here at StJLC. We've spent the last month reviewing the pathway and challenging people to take one more step. I think it's safe to say that we are now comfortable with the "make disciples" part of our God-given mission. It's the "Go" part that still makes us nervous.

Evangelism has never been the strong suit of the Lutheran church. Most of us don't know how to share the Gospel. Many of us are probably too anxious to even try. That has to change if we want to fulfill our mission to "Go and make disciples." That has to change if we want to see our church grow.

It won't happen overnight. It took us years to build a picture and pathway of discipleship. It will take us years to make evangelism part of the culture and practice of our church. But we're starting this month with a sermon series and two special events.

The sermon series is called "Go to, Come to, Do good." It looks at a Biblical model of evangelism as "Going to" where we already live, work, and play; inviting people to "Come to" church and meet Jesus; and "Doing good" in our community in Jesus' name. I'll introduce the ideas this month and work them into

the practice and mission of our church over the next few years.

We begin with a special training event on February 26. Led by Bill Mowry, my Navigators coach who has been helping me with discipleship since 2017, it will equip us to "Go to" where God has already placed us, build relationships with the people we already know, and start conversations about faith. The event is scheduled for Saturday, February 26, 9am to 12 noon. This first event is for those who want to go a little deeper and are ready to step out in faith.

The second event is for us all. February 27 is "Bring a Friend to Church Day." After preaching all February on evangelism, we'll end the month with an opportunity to invite your friends to "Come and see" (John 1:46). We'll pull out the stops to make the church as nice as we can, with a special breakfast that day and special music in our services. Then I'll get up and preach on John 3:16, "the whole Gospel in one verse." We want to make it easy for you to invite a friend to church that day, confident that we're ready to welcome them and they'll hear the Good News.

Who will you bring to church that day? Start praying for that person now. Evangelism has to begin somewhere. Let it begin this month with you.

Farewell to TTosca 2

Some of you may have seen TTosca 2, a 7-month-old Belgian Malinois, at the East entrance to the church on Sunday mornings and talked with her handlers, Doris and Tommy Blake. TTosca 2, property of the United States Government, is the first Military Working Dog (MWD) in training to serve as a mascot for St. John Lutheran Church's Emergency Response Ministry.

The MWD program is run solely by the United States Air Force, which provides fully trained dogs to all branches of the military, as well as to civilian law enforcement agencies. Qualified families, like the Blakes, provide minimal training for four months and expose new puppy trainees to a variety of sounds and social settings. Seven basic commands are taught to the puppy trainees before they move on to the next phase of their training at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio.

On January 5, 2022, TTosca 2 completed her socialization phase of training, and was returned to Lackland Air Force Base to begin her formal training. During her time at Lackland, TTosca 2 will undergo intensive training which includes, but is not limited to, drug detection, personnel protection, facility protection, and cadaver recovery. Key elements to a trainee's success are temperament and an eagerness to learn commands. At the appropriate time, a permanent dog handler will be assigned, and will work directly with their new dog until graduation from the program.

So far, Doris and Tommy have socialized six MWDs, and will continue to be part of the training program. If you have questions about the MWD program, Tommy and Doris would love to share their experiences with you.

Congratulations Doris and Tommy. You have helped keep our military personnel safe, as well as our country.

Two and a half years ago a group of St. John members toured Hill Country Daily Bread. We became interested in working with the people there to distribute food and spread God's Word to others in need. Since I had only fully retired a few months before and missed working with children and their families, I immediately felt that this is what I wanted to do.

In October of 2019, I was matched with a single mother with five children at home. She also had two older children working and going to school. It has been a joy to get to know the family and to mentor a very special lady through the trials and joys of life. She cleans houses six days a week and prepares good meals for her family. She has been going to school and will finish March 1 with a certification to be Phlebotomist or a Medical Assistant. I admire her energy and tenacity. I also enjoy our talks about challenging situations family's face and about the blessings God has given us. We pray about these things when I visit every other Wednesday, and on the phone in between when needed. It is my prayer that others may have these experiences through Growing Hope and that I can continue this special friendship for a long time.
