"Hi folks!

I'm very much looking forward to joining St. John's for my internship with my dog, Maya, and soon thereafter, my wife-to-be, Nella. (Our wedding date is set for this summer—July 16!)

I've spent the last four years in Ambridge, PA, studying at Trinity School for Ministry, working on both an M. Div. and an STM. What brought me to Ambridge was its affiliation with the NALC and its affordability. Before that, I was in Houston teaching high school math and attending First Lutheran with Pastor Evan McClanahan. That was the first Lutheran congregation I attended—I had grown up in the Methodist and non-denominational world.

In March, the St. John Council sent \$7,500 to assist with relief efforts in Ukraine. At this time, our congregation was also invited to donate to help those in need through our partnership with Samaritan's Purse.

As of April 15, St. John collected an additional \$7,060 from our members, bringing the total amount sent to Ukraine to \$14,560.

These monetary donations will be used by Samaritan's Purse at one of their five medical response locations on the ground in Ukraine. Weekly cargo planes of relief and medical supplies are being sent, along with assistance to hundreds of churches throughout the region as they minister to those during this devastating crisis. We pray for an end to this deadly conflict and for



GriefShare Support Continues

The Christian-oriented GriefShare bereavement program, under the guidance of Pastor Bergquist, is a 14-week program where participants will find support and practical advice from professionals. Each of the 14 sessions stands alone, and a participant can start at any point during the cycle. This program is available to both StJLC members and non-members.
