### A NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP

### Independence vs. Freedom

As I began contemplating the message I wanted to share with you today, I originally intended to discuss July 4 and how God gave us independence and the choice to follow Him. However, I came to realize that, like many of us, I was conflating independence with freedom. The concepts are very similar and yet also drastically different. God did grant us freedom. In the Garden of Eden, he could have chosen to not create the apple and thus forcibly keep us in a state of innocence. However, He gave us the freedom to either follow His commands or disobey and gain independence from Him. Adam and Eve used that freedom to choose independence from God and that separation caused all of the strife we have in our world today.

He says, "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." (Galatians 5:13)

In our culture, we often prize independence and scorn dependence. Our heroes are those who blazed their own path and fought against what others said to do. Independence can be a fine and noble trait when it's used to stand against those who go against God's commands. However, that very elevation of independence can make it difficult to allow ourselves to depend on God. Jesus said to not worry about tomorrow, to depend on God's help and guidance, and yet we often find ourselves trying to ensure our lives follow our own path.

We have the freedom to choose to obey God's commands today, just as Adam and Eve did in the beginning. I pray that you choose to depend on God's plan.to serve those in need in our community and to support the missions through the world. Hi folks!

Thank you so much for your warm welcome in the form of greetings, cards, gift cards, snacks, meals, and food. I opened most of them while FaceTiming Nella (my fiancée) and she really appreciated being included. Your generosity is abundant, and we are both very grateful.

I'm looking forward to getting to know as many of you as I can in the next month and a half, and I'm even more excited to introduce you all to Nella after our wedding in July — she's easily the better half. Nella will be able to continue her job from Pittsburgh—in automotive supply chain distribution—

remotely while she's in Texas. We are both looking forward to meeting and sharing meals with folks.

Meals are at the very center of the Christian tradition, just as they are the center of all life. It was a forbidden meal (the fruit which Eve and Adam long ago ate) that brought sin and death into the world, and it is the sacrificial meal (that bread and wine which we on Sundays eat) which destroys sin and brings life.

Whereas there are liturgical and theological elements that I appreciate as a Christian in the Lutheran tradition, it was neither the liturgy nor the theology that drew me to the Lutheran tradition. Rather, it was a meal. The first time I

attended a Lutheran church, the great church ladies baked cookies for after church fellowship and then thanked me for eating their homemade cookies. That was exactly backwards, and so, of course, I thanked them.

The gift of those cookies and the overgenerosity of thanking me for eating them is one of the main reasons I returned the next Sunday, and the next, and the next. And so, it was a special surprise to find cookies in a welcome bag, and muffins in the fridge.

Meals are not merely ordinary.
