# From the Pastor's Pen

Moving down from up North, I still find it hard to believe that school starts in August. Growing up in New York, we didn't start school until after Labor Day and the end of the New York State Fair (if you think Texas brisket is good, wait until you try a Central New York baked bean sandwich with a side of salt potatoes!). But as the saying goes, I'm "not in Kansas anymore." The start of the school year is here, and it brings the start of the church program year, too. I've got two big initiatives teed up for the Fall, both focused on the Bible.

The first is an eleven-week sermon series called "David. a Man After God's Own Heart." I loved preaching through Revelation last Fall. This year, I wanted to preach an in-depth series from the Old Testament. I've always loved the story of King David. It's got everything: intrigue, action, romance, suspense, heroism, tragedy, and more. This narrative from a thousand years before Christ still captivates us today as an all-too-human tale of divine love and faithfulness. I've been wanting to preach through it ever since I wrote my dissertation on it back in 2008. Join me as we begin this series this Fall on August 14.

The other big initiative for the Fall is a Bible study called Crossways. Ever since we took the Reveal survey in 2019, I've been eager to teach a regular Bible study of my own. I've had chances to teach New Members classes, and topical classes, and even the occasional class on a book of the Bible. But now at last I can teach through the whole Bible itself! Crossways is an in-depth journey through all 66 books of the Bible, emphasizing the historical and cultural context of the times, but focused on how the hero of the Bible is God and the story of the Bible is how God works through covenants to choose and redeem us by grace. I've taught it before and can honestly say that I know of no other resource which better connects the Old and New Testaments into one great story of God. Crossways is a 60-session Bible study that takes 2 years to complete. You don't have to commit to the whole thing, but I do encourage you to try out this first 10-week session on the first 5 books of the Bible. Join me on Wednesday nights starting August 17. School's in session and I'm excited to go deep into the Bible with you,

My prayer for you is that you will continue God's work

through faith, love, and hope. Serve your community and your world. Support the church in its mission to bring the Gospel to all people. Pray daily. Amen.






