A NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP

The Rewards of Giving

A guiding principle found throughout the Bible is that we need to be generous to others and, in turn, Cod will reward us-Proverbs 11 is a good example of this. This verse's advice may seem counter-intuitive, especially in our money-centric world. However, I think there are three things we can take from this verse to help us understand God's purpose.

First, note that the admonishment is to not withhold unduly-not to withhold nothing. Indeed, just a few verses later in Proverbs 21:20 we are told that a wise man saves his money while a fool frivolously spends his. God does not want

"One man gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty. A generous man will prosper; he who refreshes others will himself be refreshed." *Proverbs* 11:24-25

money to be the central focus of our lives; instead, we should use the treasures he has given us to help others.

Second, realize that there is more to generosity and poverty than simply a monetary value. You can be generous with your time or talents to help others. Anyone who has ever helped others knows that, while you may be weary afterwards, that service helps us appreciate our lives and those around us even more.

Finally, note that the reward we will receive is to prosper and be refreshed. God does not say that if we follow his commands we will gain more money, because He knows that is not what we truly need. Indeed, we find constant examples of those with

immense wealth and yet lacking happiness and peace. The race for the most money is ultimately a fruitless race which only distances us further from God.

Give freely, help others, and enjoy the life God has given you.

THE VICAR'S CORNER

Thanks to everyone who helped with and came out to our wedding celebration in August! Nella and I both really appreciated it and felt welcomed by it.

For this article, I'll remind us what I've preached on and connect it again to our lives. So far I've preached about:

- the demon possessed man, and how because he went to Jesus, he proved himself to be the most sane man in the town (Luke 8:26-39)
- how we are also among the 70 sent out into the harvest to help fill up the "phone book" of the Book of Life (Luke 10:1-20)

• that Jesus is our judge, that he will return, and that whether he finds us faithful or unfaithful is of eternal consequence (Luke 12:13-48)

In each of these lessons, we're reminded that the world as it appears and the truth about the world are different. The raving lunatic demon-possessed man is sane because of his posture towards Jesus. The 70 are sent out bringing nothing physical (no food, no money) yet bring with them the gift of the eternal to any who would hear. The rich man with his fat retirement is proved to be a fool because he does not consider God. The beauty of the lilies proves God's care for us. The very kingdom of God is a gift to those who trust God. Jesus will return and judge the living and the dead, ruling in favor of those whose faith is in him and ruling against those who have rejected him.

What other Scriptures have helped you see the truth about the world? In what ways have you noticed that the world gets truth wrong? What Scriptures have helped you turn from old ways to ways that are shaped by Jesus?
