## From the Pastor's Pen

The month of November begins with the saints who have gone to be with Jesus, and ends as we prepare for Jesus to come again. The first Sunday of the month, November 6, is All Saints. Jesus promises, "Whoever believes in me, though they die, yet shall they live; and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die" (John 11:25-26). On All Saints Sunday we remember those who have died with faith in Jesus Christ, and remember Jesus' unfailing promise to them. Come join us as we honor their memory and thank Jesus for His victory.

The following Sunday I start a two-week miniseries on stewardship called "**Consecration and Thanksgiving**." The first Sunday, November 13, focuses on giving as an act of discipleship. I'll preach about how we consecrate, or "set aside," a proportion of our money to give to the Lord's work in this church. I'll give a couple of illustrations of what that "setting aside" might look like. Pledge Cards will arrive in the mail the next week. We ask you to fill them out and bring them back on November 20 for Consecration Sunday, when we lay them down before the Lord. I'll use

that as an opportunity to say "thank you" to St. John and equip people with some Scriptures and prayers to share around the Thanksgiving table.

The final Sunday of the month begins the season of **Advent**. Advent looks forward to the birth of Jesus Christ, and this year we'll prepare ourselves by looking at the "other characters" in the story: Zechariah and Elizabeth, Joseph and Mary. We'll learn from them how to welcome the Lord into our lives.




