From the Pastor's Pen

The start of the school year brings the start of the church program year. As the students return to their books, I like to see our congregation get into the Good Book. Two years ago at this time we preached through the Book of Revelation. Last year, we preached through the life

of King David. This year, we'll preach our way through six Books of the Bible: Amos, Hosea, Micah, Jonah, Nahum, and Habakkuk. They were six of the "Minor Prophets"—not because they were unimportant, but because they didn't write nearly as much as the "Major Prophets" like Isaiah and Jeremiah. I taught the Minor Prophets this last Spring as part of the Crossways Bible Study, and I was struck by how similar their time was to our own. God gave the Minor Prophets to Israel and Judah at a time when those nations were falling apart. God sent the Minor Prophets to call His people back from their sin and toward faithful living before it was too late, before culture collapsed and darkness took over. God told the Minor Prophets to proclaim His great faithfulness and love for a faithless and unloving people. God still speaks through the Minor Prophets today. Join us September 10 as we begin our sixweek sermon series "Minor Prophets, Major Problems." Once again this year, we'll have a bookmark so you can read

through the Bible every day at home

and come to church on Sunday prepared.

Once again this year, we welcome Pastor Jordan Long back to our church. Pr. Long is the President of the Lutheran Church of South Sudan, one of the global mission partners of the North American Lutheran Church. Pr. Long visited in 2021

Church. Pr. Long visited in 2021 and preached about how his Lutheran Church continues to meet in refugee camps, to minister to displaced persons, to train pastors, and even to grow as South Sudan is plunged into chaos and civil war. This time, Pr. Long will teach during the Sunday School hour and update us on his work. Join him Labor Day weekend, **September 3**, at 9:30am in the Family Life Center for a time of learning and conversation, of questions and answers.

Finally, join us **September 24** for the congregation's **Annual Meeting**, when we'll elect new members to our Church Council and vote on the 2024 church budget. The meeting will be held in the Sanctuary immediately after the Late Service. Annual Meeting packets will be available at the Information Desk starting September 17 so you can read through the materials ahead of time and come informed. Join us to let your voice be heard and your vote counted.




Women's Retreat
