October ended with a **field trip** to Boerne Middle School North where we saw their musical rendition of **Finding Nemo**. In addition to all of our community events, the staff and students are enjoying the rigor of the Abeka curriculum and the favorite part of everyone's day is chapel; where church members are always welcome to attend at 11:30am.

In **November** we are looking forward to the lower elementary class **field trip** to Boerne Radio, **visits** to Morningside at Menger Springs, being a sponsor of the David Crowder **concert** on November 12, the Comfort **Christmas Parade** and our monthly **visits** with a farmer from Texas Farm Bureau (this month we will be learning about sugar cane).


