## A Note from Pastor Bergquist

Most of you know by now that I will be retiring from ministry at the end of this month. It has been a wonderful journey. I have served the Lord and His Church as a minister of the Word and Sacrament for nearly 35 years.

I started seminary in Poland in 1981 with the intention of becoming a teacher in religion (my church - The Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Augsburg Confession in Poland did not ordain women). In 1985 I had the opportunity to obtain a scholarship from Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, IA to study in their Master of Sacred Theology program. Wartburg Seminary had a large group of international students and they worked with the American Lutheran Church Women (ALCW) to sponsor women in the seminary. I was one of the grateful recipients of the funds from the ALCW. I will always be grateful to Wartburg Seminary and the American Lutheran Church Women for creating a path for me into ordained ministry.

After graduation from the seminary I interned at St John Lutheran Church in Austin, TX from 1989-1990. On December 16, 1990, I was ordained into the Ministry of Word and Sacrament by the Bishop of the Southwestern Texas Synod, the Rev. Henry Schulte.

My first call was to two rural congregations in Taylor, TX. From 1990-1995 I served as a solo pastor of Prince of Peace and Immanuel Lutheran Churches in Taylor. In my second call, I was a mission pastor at St. Mark Lutheran Church in Adkins, TX from 1995-1999. After the birth of our daughter, Anna, our family moved to Boerne, TX in June of 1999.

In February 2000 I started working at St. John as a contract pastor. In September 2001, the congregation extended to me a part time call as a visitation pastor which I completed in February of 2017. In March 2017 I received a full-time call to serve as Associate Pastor at St John.



During the last 24 years at St.

John, I have had the privilege to serve with many wonderful people, pastors, co-workers, lay leaders, and volunteers. I have played different pastoral roles: preacher, presider, teacher, spiritual counselor, and administrator. But my "true love" was always visitation ministry with the elderly and the homebound. I built strong relationships with those who were no longer actively involved in the life of the congregation due to age and health conditions, but who loved their church and wanted to be part of it. I learned valuable lessons from their life experiences and accumulation of wisdom. I am thankful for meeting all the interesting and caring people who have truly enriched my life.

I want to thank all of you for your great support of my ministry and my family. I will never forget the love, compassion and thoughtfulness you demonstrated toward my family during my husband's illness and death. You helped us bear the burden of those difficult circumstances. Anna and I will always be grateful to you for your genuine love and support.

I will miss you all! I will miss the fellowship, the worship experiences, learning together from Scripture, laughing, and having fun together. I will miss your presence but together we will continue to serve the great Lord Jesus Christ and His Kingdom here on earth through spreading the gospel and embracing those who need His love.

## DISASTER LUTHERAN CHURCH RESPONSE

A few weeks ago, Robin Scheel and Randy Sibley made the long journey to the Panhandle, hauling trailers loaded with hay and feed to give to the ranchers so they could feed their stock. Their story is beautiful and abundant in blessings, a true testament to the way the Lord works through our hands as we serve our brothers and sisters. Here is a message from Robin:

"Greetings All. I want to thank our Emergency Relief Committee and everyone in our congregation who supports it. I also want to thank the friends who donated funds to make this trip possible. The Lord led me to believe that I needed to make the effort to help some people affected by the fires in the Panhandle. Pastor Waters was so encouraging. He put me in touch with Frank Bush and Dr. Miller. I met with the committee and supplied prices and estimated how much I could haul. By this time my brother, Colin, and Randy Sibley wanted to help. St John purchased 16 round bales of hay, three pallets of cattle cubes and nine mineral buckets. Friends here in Boerne contributed funds for our expenses as well as discounted the price of tires for my trailer. These same people thanked us for allowing them to help as well as thanking us for being willing to make the trip. We left pulling two trailers with as much feed as we could haul, going to Pampa to one of the distribution centers. The people we met while traveling thanked us as well. On two different occasions

complete strangers gave us cash to help pay our fuel costs! The hay price was discounted by ranchers Cody and Chad Holubec from Melvin. The other supplies from Behrends Feed in Luckenbach were discounted to us when they learned that the people of St. John were paying for them. Our lunch was paid for by the friend Roy, who referred the hay seller to us. The hotel owner in Turkey, Texas discounted our room and donated our breakfast because we were traveling in the Lord's name. These people all responded to the Lord's prompting and a desire to help!

All together this was an amazing trip. Everything came together in a few days. The Lord provided everything needed. The encouragement we both received and gave was heartfelt. The feed we hauled won't last lona: but the changes in our heart will endure. When the Lord prompts you, please choose to follow. The blessings are mighty and far-reaching. We appreciate everyone's prayers for our trip. Please remember the people in the fire zones and the many who are still hauling and helping in the provision and recovery of the Panhandle. May God Bless you all".
