## From the Desk of Pastor Eric Waters

November is a month to look forward to at StJLC.

We begin by **looking back** with gratitude. The month begins with **All Saints' Sunday** on November 2, when we remember those who died in faith this last year and now rest in peace with Jesus. The month ends with **Thanksgiving** on November 27, when we give God thanks for family, friends, and all the blessings He has given us. In between is **Veterans Day** on November 11. This year we'll honor all veterans for their service with a noon luncheon in the Family Life Center, prepared by the Grill Guys and hosted by our StJLC School. All veterans in the community are invited.

We **look ahead** to what the future holds for our church. Council and the Building Committee have approved a Centennial Vision to mark the 100th year of StJLC in 2029. Council has proposed the **purchase of 310 Rosewood Avenue**, the property directly across the street from our Sanctuary. Our church is landlocked, and buying adjacent property when it becomes available is a wise investment in our future and gives flexibility to our building plans. Council will host an informational **Townhall meeting November 2** after the Late Service as



an opportunity to learn more and ask questions. Council has called a special **Congregational Meeting on November 16** after the Late Service to vote on the proposal. I encourage you to come and support the purchase. That same day, November 16, I'll preach my annual stewardship sermon. Pledge Cards will arrive in your mailbox that week. I ask you to prayerfully consider your 2026 support and bring your completed Pledge Card to church on November 23, **Consecration Sunday**, when we'll lay them down before the Lord as an act of worship. Your faithful giving makes it possible to do all that we do as a church, now and into the future.

November ends as we look to the coming of Jesus. **Advent** begins November 30 with a special sermon series on Marriage and Parenting. Mary and Joseph prepared for the Christ Child; we prepare our hearts to welcome Him and equip our families to serve Him in practical ways. Join us Tuesday, November 25 as we **decorate the church for Christmas** and prepare to welcome over a thousand guests to our church.

November is a month to look forward to. Join us!

# A MESSAGE FROM OUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT

As your Council President, I want to take this opportunity to share with you some issues the Council has been working on over the past few months. Besides the responsibility of general oversight of the usual business matters of the church, we have focused on a few important matters I would like to address in a bit more detail.

First, with the continuing growth of our church congregation comes the responsibility to provide sufficient resources to support our many programs and offerings. One major key to this is the need for space - both new space and renovation of existing space. Development of a campus Master Plan in 2019 provided critical information on the needs and opinions of a wide sampling of our congregation and detailed a path for campus expansion. However, this plan was not fully implemented in the following years for a number of reasons (Covid-19 pandemic, changes in Boerne city building requirements and limitations, addition of our church school, etc.). Nevertheless, the needs for space have continued to

expand. Over the past few months the Council has focused on addressing how best to meet our space needs. A Building Committee has been established to work with a panel of architectural, engineering, and construction consultants to determine how best to move forward with revision of the previous Master Plan. Additionally, the Council is considering the purchase of additional property to expand our existing "campus footprint". Clearly, these issues will be critical decisions for the congregation in the near future.

Another focus for the Council has been the periodic need to review church administrative policies and procedures as well as assessment of important human resource services for church staff members. These efforts are underway with revision in our financial policy governing expenditures and payments, as well as reviewing our existing insurance coverages for both property and staff medical/health matters.

Finally, the Council realizes that with the growth of our congregation, providing

the ability to reach out to other members becomes a necessity. Along these lines, the Council has approved the development of StJLC LINK to establish a searchable church directory of member interests leading to shared experiences over time. Additionally, production of a congregational picture directory is planned for early next year.

In closing, your Council has been busy with the work of the church. While serving on the Council could be viewed as an interesting challenge, there is no doubt such service provides enjoyable and meaningful experiences overall. New members of the Council will be needed next year to serve as Treasurer or Chair of the Property, Benevolence, or Congregational Care Committees. Come join us. If you are interested, please feel free to contact any current Council Member for additional information.
